Last Saturday, cross country team took it to Huron for the state meet. The girls took first place last year, looking to defend their title going into Saturday's race. Unfortunately they were held back, but did secure fourth place as a team.


They tried their hardest, which is all that matters. Taking thirteenth place and being the top finisher for Garretson girls, Carmel Bohl finished at a total time of 15.29.82. Shortly behind was Haley Sage 15:48.29, placing 22nd. Rachel Kindt, 20th, ran a 16:12.49. Teisha Carnicle, 33rd, paced at a 16:17.35. Peyton Sage crossed the line at 16:53.59, finishing 55th and Jaden Bly rounded out the Garretson squad with a time of 17:47.03, 98th.

The boys also ran on Saturday. Last year they took third place as a team and were looking for a way to improve that. They did. Garretson took second place overall. Junior Evan Fick was the top finisher for Garretson, taking seventh place; he had a total time of 16:57.81. Josh Powell, 20th, finished at


